

I am a lifelong Iowan. I am a graduate of Briar Cliff University in Sioux City, Iowa with a BA in History and Political Science. I have an adult son and have served in the Iowa Legislature from 1993-1996 in the Iowa House and was elected to the Iowa Senate in 1996 and served there until 2018. I was elected to the Polk County Board of Supervisors in 2018 and currently serving my second term on the board.

Tell us more about the organization/organizations that you help to lead and what are some of your goals, objectives and things you are looking forward to doing during your term or in the future?

As a county supervisor, one of my objectives is to bring transparency and accountability to county government. I have continued to try to share taxpayer investments and spending with constituents, including grants that are funded annually through our partnership with Polk County and Prairie Meadows Racetrack & Casino to non-profits that serve the community. As Chair of the Board of Supervisors in 2020, I helped lead the county through the challenges of COVID-19 and worked with the board to stand up services, provide medically informative data, and protect vulnerable individuals.

What led you to get involved in politics?

A desire to be of service to others. In college, I began as a social worker involved in ensuring vulnerable individuals had access to food & shelter, and I learned how great this need was for the community. I was in college when Iowa beef processors broke the union in Sioux City, IA, and I watched the families that donated regularly to our food shelter become recipients during this time. I served as Student Body President at my college and assisted on political campaigns at the state and national level. I served for five years on the Polk County Conservation Board and took my first run for office at age 25.

What advice would you have for those who may wish to get more involved with politics or run for office?

There has never been a better time or more important work to do than to involve yourself in the political process and/or run for public office. Our way of life depends upon a strong democratic republic. This involves competent and passionate individuals to serve at the local, state, and federal levels in our government. I would encourage individuals who have a passion to get involved in helping like-minded candidates or causes.

Is there anything else you would like to share with our readers?

There is a profound need for civil discussion in our political discourse. We are divided and polarized in profound ways that we've never seen before. It's important that we learn to disagree in ways that don't villainize each other and our common human experience.
